MINISTERS: ALL THE PEOPLE OF FAITH

By the time you are reading this, we will be in Advent. So this is an opportune time to put some thought into our Advent season; Advent, the coming of something important. The term is an anglicized version of the Latin word dventus, *meaning* "coming". Advent for us, is the coming of the most important thing in our lives, the birth of Jesus.

How will we prepare for the coming of our Lord here at Faith Lutheran? I pray that each one of us will spend a little extra time remembering the true reason we celebrate Christmas. **Our services may be in person or online** depending what the church council decides as they discern how to keep us safe during the increased Covid numbers in our area. Make a decision to spend more time reflecting and worshiping our Lord as we celebrate his birth whether it be in your home, on TV, at church, or online.

I have listed the services below. I hope the explanation of services will help you decide which ones you and your family don't want to miss. But remember, we don't know if they will be in person and online or just online until the council meets on December 5^{th} following worship.

We have 12 services in December: Every Sunday, Advent services on Wednesdays, the Sunday School program, a Blue Christmas worship on the longest night of the year, Christmas Eve worship.

Our **Mid-week Advent services** are an excellent way to put the emphasis on the true meaning of Christmas for you and your family. These shorter worship services will adhere to what the council decides. **Holy Darkness:**Service of Word and Prayer will be used on Wednesday nights. We are a people of the word. We encounter the living God in Jesus Christ. These services will be simple and follow the Advent themes of listening, waiting, and expectation. We will embrace the darkness of these long Advent nights as a place where we encounter the beauty and mystery of God.

If safe to do so, we will gather for the winter solstice, the longest night and the beginning of winter. Depending on the council decision, it may be online only. The service is entitled **Blue Christmas:** A service of night prayer for the winter solstice. December 25th is celebrated as Christmas, the day of Jesus' birth. It is celebrated that day as Christmas because it had been incorrectly identified as the winter solstice. The early Christians intended this to be a feast of proclamation. God arrives by way of deep darkness. Christians wanted to tell the world that God, the maker of the cosmos, chose to lovingly draw near to our broken world by way of a human birth on the longest night of the year. God's love for us goes deep and does not fade or change with the seasons.

So, let us prepare for the coming of our Lord this Advent season. And may we not rush the Christmas season but celebrate Christmas for the **whole 12 days!** We've been through this before so we will wait and see what happens with COVID and the council's

Christmas is a season of celebration but for many of us, the lack of daylight intensifies other suffering. The weight of depression grows heavier when light is scarce. We become stressed when our calendars fill with extra social obligations. We fear interactions with family members that have been difficult in the past. Our losses in the past year and the years before often haunt us at Christmas. This past year especially, all of us have had losses. Some have lost loved ones and there are also other losses that can cause us pain. Perhaps one has lost the ability to do things because of health, or lost their job and also finances then have become tight. There are so many things we grieve at this time of year.

So this service offers the message of Christmas that is specifically sent for those in pain and suffering. It is not always that "all is merry and bright." Rather it is the abiding truth that God seeks to be with us, even when we are "blue". I have found this service healing to all who have attended in the past. I hope you can join me for this special service.
